

UNICORN GROCERY, MANCHESTER

Groundbreaking natural wetlands pond delivers the ultimate in biodiverse roof



The roof of the Unicorn Grocery in Manchester was treated to a biodiverse green roof which features the first roof pond.

This excellent example of a biodiverse roof has attracted considerable interest and the scheme to install the living roof is part of the 'Make Room for Black Redstarts' project, part of the wider biodiversity action plan for Greater Manchester. The installation of the roof was supported by a £24,685 funding donation from the SITA Trust.

As this green roof installation was a retro-fit, the existing waterproofing layer of Permaphalt mastic asphalt, which had only been installed 3 years ago, provided the perfect base. The clients wanted to upgrade the insulation and the installation of the brown roof provided the ideal opportunity to do this. Supertherm XPS insulation was installed.

IKO's Plasfeed 4+1 drainage / retention board was applied to provide a base for the biodiverse roof mix. IKOgreen edge retention trim, part of IKO PLC's extensive range of living roof products, was then installed to perimeter kerbs to complete the project. Permaphalt is a specially formulated mastic asphalt roofing, using advanced polymer technology to give the ideal combination of long term durability, increased fatigue resistance, improved temperature stability and ease of installation. The Permaphalt system was installed with a 20 year guarantee and it was the best option for the building owner to keep the continuity.
